David Hooker is an Assistant Professor,
University of Guelph, stationed at Ridgetown
College in southern Ontario. As a field crop
agronomist, his research goal is to develop a
better understanding of field crop systems for
developing science-based solutions for
improving corn, soybean, and wheat
production. Dr. Hooker has a wide range of
interests including intensive management in
cereal performance testing, tillage and
rotational studies, and management of
Fusarium head blight.
